Internship Description

Program Description



The Nutrition Graduate Program and Combined Dietetic Internship lead to a Master of Science degree designed to prepare graduates for professional practice or for doctoral study. The degree requires 39 semester hours. All students complete a research project and have the option of writing a thesis.





Program Design:

The Program is structured to be completed in 21 months. For the first year of the program, students take graduate level courses and design and implement a research project. During the second year of the program students usually move to their primary internship site and commute to Appalachian State one day per month.

Courses Include:

- Research Methods in Nutrition and Foods
- Advanced Nutritional Assessment
- Maternal and Child Nutrition
- Nutrition for Older Adults
- Statistics
- Dietetic Practice I/II (6 credits)
- Dietetic Internship (12 hours)
- Approved elective to complement career goals Students work with their advisor and graduate committee to plan a program of study and to implement a research program.

- Vitamin D deficiency among African-American women of child bearing age
- Effects of antioxidant supplements on oxidant status after strenuous exercise
- Improve after-school exercise program by adding nutrition education component

Admission Process:

- Completion of accredited undergraduate program in dietetics (DPD).
- Submission of two applications:
 - Online application to the ASU Graduate School including official transcripts.
- ♦ Submission of online Dietetic Internship application through DICAS.

Admission Criteria:

- Graduate School:
 - ♦ GPA greater than 3.0
 - Completion of GRE within last five years
- Internship: GPA, references, work experience, goals/objectives, community service, honors/ leadership, faculty judgment.
